

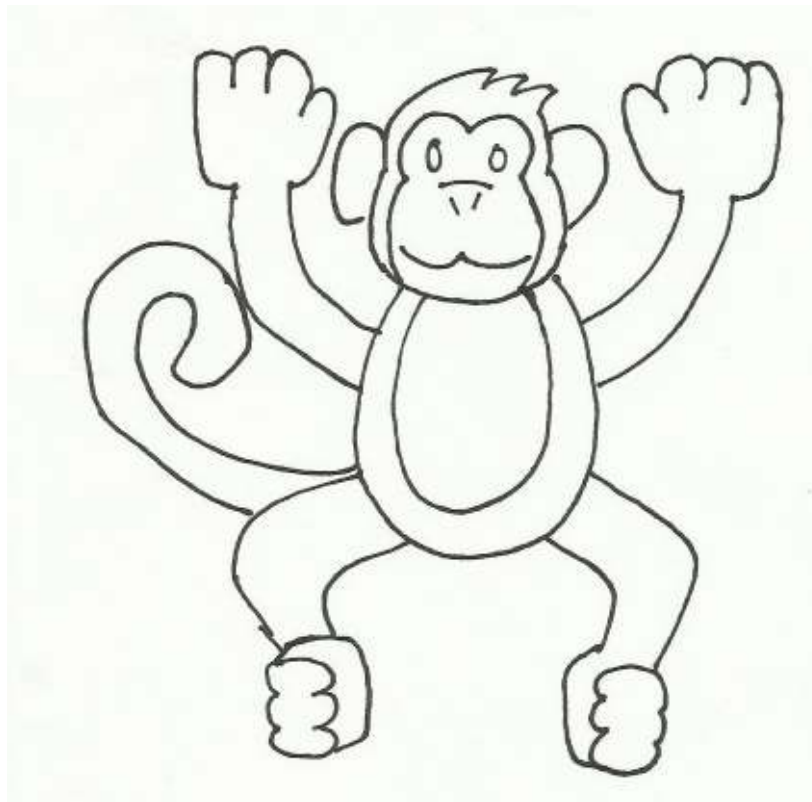
Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed Felt Board Characters

This is a favorite song among the children I teach. So I decided that I would make some felt board characters for the children to play and sing with while we are doing our Circle Time.



When you are finished, your finished monkey, sans clothing should look like the one pictured below, when all details have been drawn in. I ended up cutting out eyes and a mouth for my monkeys cause my fine tip marker wasn't dark enough for the children in my class to see.

Patterns for the clothing I used in the first photo are provided, I put little dots on the girls' dresses, but you can decorate them however you'd like.

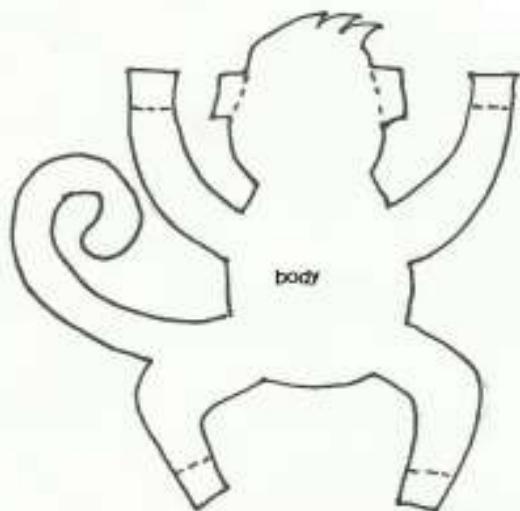
Number of pieces to make:

Piece 1: make 5 (there are five monkeys after all)

Piece 2: make 5

Pieces 3, 4 and 5: make 20

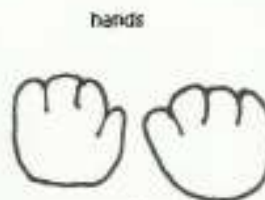
You can decide how many boys and how many girls you want in your group of five monkeys.



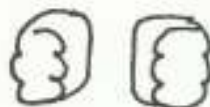

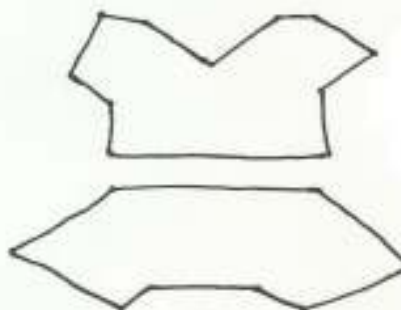

*Note: Dotted lines on the main body denote where the hands, ear and feet should be attached.



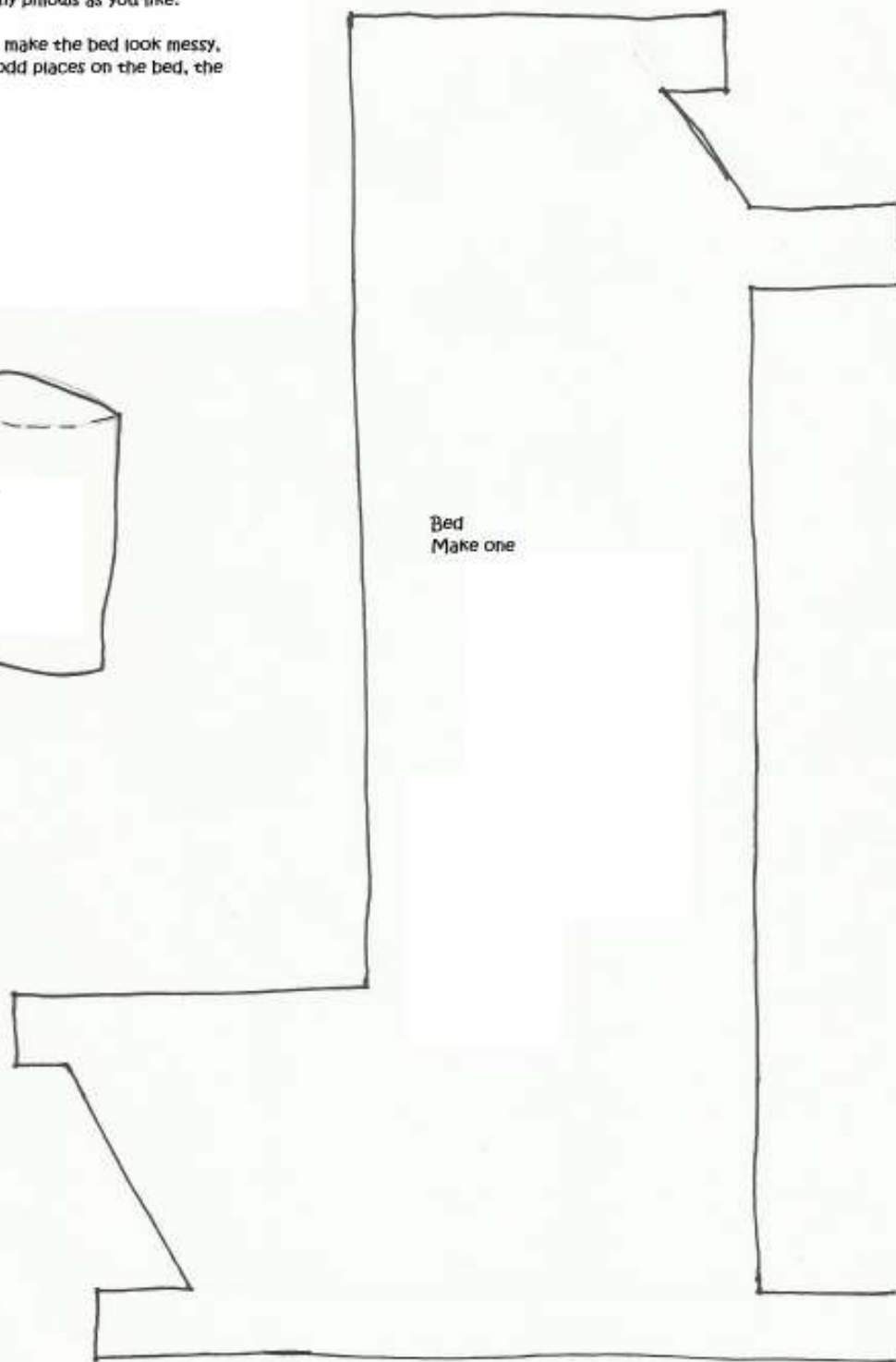
Girl Monkey Dress

You can make as many pillows as you like.

The point here is to make the bed look messy,
the more pillows in odd places on the bed, the
better.



Now for the construction of the bed:

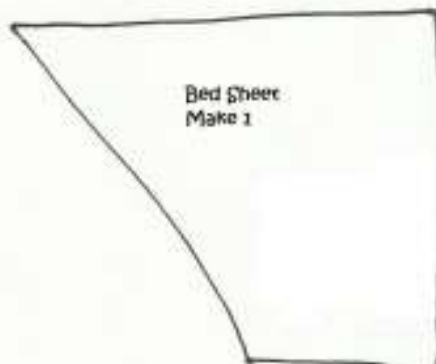
Step one: Glue the sheet to the bed near where the head board is.

Step two: glue the blanket on top of that, making sure that the foot of the blanket matches and covers the foot of the bed frame.

Step three: glue the pillows on willy-nilly to make the bed look messy, and presto! you have a bed that looks like its been jumped on by five haughty monkeys.
